14. Insurance and Medical Care

(1) Medical Insurance

In Japan there are 2 types of medical insurance: social health insurance and National Health Insurance. These policies aim to reduce medical expenses in case of sickness and injury. Regardless of nationality, Japanese citizens and foreigners alike are obliged to enroll in one of them.

Once you are subscribed to an insurance, an insurance certificate (insurance card) is issued. You can receive treatment by presenting your health insurance certificate to a receptionist at a medical facility. The insurance covers a portion of medical expenses.

Social Health Insurance (KENKO HOKEN)

This insurance is for those who work for companies. This comes together with employee pension.

Who can join? Full-time employee and his or her dependents

Insurance Premium Decided based on employee's salary. The employer

and the employee each bear 50% of the premium. The employee's share is deducted from the employee's salary.

National Health Insurance (KOKUMIN KENKO HOKEN)

This insurance is for free-lance professionals, the self-employed, and those who are not enrolled in a social health insurance plan.

Who can join? Those who have completed alien registration and are

approved to stay in Japan for more than 1 year.

Insurance Premium The premium, which is based on the previous year's

income, assets, and how many people in the family enroll in the insurance, is paid in 8 installments every year. If you have not paid taxes in Japan the previous year, minimum premium is charged for the first year.

* If you are not enrolled in either insurance policy, you must bear the full medical expenses.

April 1st, 2007

Notification is required in the following cases:

- a) When the head of a household or family name changes
- b) When you move
- c) When a family member dies or has a baby
- d) When you retire or get a new job and change insurance campanies
- e) When a family member becomes an insured dependent or leaves the insurance
- f) When you return to your country

Be sure to notify each office listed under & of the change.

(2) Nursing Care Insurance (KAIGO HOKEN)

With population aging rapidly, an increased number of elderly people require nursing care. Nursing care services are available when an elderly who is bedridden or has dementia requires nursing care and support in a daily life.

Nursing Care Insurance Eligibility for Foreigners

Those who have completed alien registration, have either a permanent resident status or Period of Stay of more than 1 year, and approved to stay for more than 1 year judging from current living conditions.

- a) 65 years old and up
- b) those who are 40 to 65 years old and have Japanese public medical insurance

(3) Medical Facilities

When you are to see doctor, bring your insurance card with you, tell the receptionist the name of the person to be examined, and wait for your turn in the waiting room. Enter the consultation room when your name is called. After the examination, you will receive medicine and make your payment. Some medical facilities will give an "Ingai Shoho" (Out-of-hospital prescription), which you need to take to a pharmacy to purchase your medicine.

Please note that medical services and operating hours differ by facility.

When you receive the notification, please receive the vaccination at the designated location or any medical facility where such service is provided.
