16. Japanese Education


(1) The Japanese Education System

The Japanese education system is explained in the following chart.

In Japan, children must study for 9 years between the ages of 6 and 15 at elementary and then junior high school as compulsory education.

School starts on April 1st and ends on March 31st.

Terms are divided into 1st term (April to August), 2nd term (September to December) and 3rd term (January to March). Some schools have another system: former term (April to September) and latter term (October to March)



Elementary and Junior High School

Under Japanese law, a child of a foreign national is not obligated to enroll in a Japanese school. However, it is possible to enroll upon request.

Procedures

- a) Complete your alien registration at the Toyohashi City Hall Citizens Registry Division (SHIMIN-KA) on the 1st floor. (see p.19)
- b) Go to the Toyohashi City Hall Board of Education School-Education Division (GAKKO KYOIKU-KA) on the 11th floor and tell them of your intentions to enroll your child.
- c) The School-Education Division will designate the school and grade-level for your child and issue a School Entrance Notification (TEN-NYUGAKU SHITEI TSUCHI-SHO).
- d) Go to the school where your child is scheduled to attend and have a conference.

Nursery School (HOIKU-EN)

Nursery schools look after children who have not started school yet and whose family cannot look after them at home as a result of both parents working full time, have fallen ill, etc.

There are both public and private nurseries available in Toyohashi.

a) Nursery School Hours

- * Some nursery schools provide extended daycare services (until 7:00 pm) for a fee
- b) Nursery School Fees

Fees are divided into 10 levels, and differ depending on the guardian's income level from the previous fiscal year.

d) Other

It is possible to enroll your child in the middle of the year, provided space is available. Immediate enrollment may not be possible at some nursery schools. In addition, you must inform of any changes in your job or family situation to the nursery school.

Preschool (YOCHI-EN)

Preschool accepts children from 3 years of age until they start elementary school. Please directly inquire individual preschools for details.
